March 2019 MEETING HIGHLIGHTS

AWG hosts Keith Gotschall for March 2019 meeting demonstration

Keith Gotschall is a professional wood turner from Colorado, where he teaches and fabricates in his shop. Keith demonstration was unique in the way he demonstrated the fabrication and the article fabricated; a "Scottish Quaich". A Quaich is a shallow cup with two handles evenly spaced on the rim, traditionally used for drinking whiskey and ales. Believed to have originated around the 16th century. Traditionally these were made from wood, although today pewter and other metals are found.

Keith's demonstration included various skill levels and a couple of "hidden" fabrication techniques . At the end of the demonstration we were presented with a nice example of a simple Quaich as well as some knowledge for turning the winged vessel. Thank you Keith!


